

Executive Order B-37-16 (Water Conservation)

- Aug 16th -- SWRCB releases stress test results; of 379 suppliers submitting results, 36 indicated a potential supply shortage in 2019 under assumed repeat of 3 prior dry years' hydrology
- Statewide water conservation at 21.5% in June
- Summer 2016 Save Our Water conservation campaign launched with theme "Water Conservation, It's for Life"

Local Statistics – Running Totals

- 25 local emergency proclamations from counties
- 10 local emergency proclamations from cities
- 12 local emergency proclamations from special districts
- 10 tribal emergency proclamations
- Main purpose of emergency proclamations is to qualify for state financial assistance

State Emergency Financial Assistance

- Since January 2014, 122 of the 176 projects approved for emergency funding for interim replacement drinking water (public water systems) by SWRCB have been executed. For the latest round of \$19M in emergency appropriations to SWRCB, requests have been received for \$15.4M
- This week, DWR began connecting homes in unincorporated East Porterville to the City of Porterville's water system. The new distribution system will replace private wells that were either dry or contaminated. Estimated state costs for phase 1 of the emergency construction project for this DAC are about \$16M. DWR continues design work on several other similar emergency construction projects for permanent hook-ups in Tulare County.
- The Department of Social Services continues distribution of emergency food assistance in farmworker communities suffering high unemployment due to drought. Recent distributions in Fresno, Kings, Tulare, Kern, Merced, SLO, Santa Cruz, and Sutter counties.

Wildfire Risk

- Governor's Tree Mortality Task Force – Aug 2016 meeting. Work continues on mapping/monitoring, resource utilization (e.g., bioenergy potential & market development), regulations. CEC \$15M bioenergy grants announced in July.
- CALFIRE reports 4,084 fires covering 150,498 acres this calendar year through Aug 20th, in non-federal responsibility areas
- Active response now on 3 large state-jurisdiction fires – Soberanes (Big Sur), Chimney (SLO County), & Rey (Santa Barbara)
