## **2026 Western Drought Media Briefings**

Wednesday, July 8, 2026

### **Intermountain West and California/Nevada Drought Early Warning Systems (DEWS)**

10:30 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. MT

The 2026 Western Drought Media Briefings will assemble media professionals and drought experts for two regional briefings on drought conditions and response efforts in the Western United States.

To ensure media have accurate, up-to-date data to cover these critical environmental stories, NOAA's National Integrated Drought Information System (NIDIS), alongside partners across levels of government and economic sectors, will host two regional virtual media briefings. The briefings will provide the latest information on current drought, heat, and fire conditions and forecasts, as well as the serious impacts to diverse sectors of the economy and communities throughout the West. Perspectives from those on the ground who are responding to drought conditions will be shared.
